

PILGRIMAGE OF THE MIGRANT JUBILEE CROSS: THURS 20th NOV 5:30PM, UNANDERRA

The Australian Catholic Migrant and Refugee Office have created this initiative as a reminder of the contributions of migrants and refugees to the Church in Australia, and of the Church as a place of refuge, unity and peace for all. The cross is embedded with relics of the Holy Family, who themselves had to leave their home country to seek refuge in time of peril– these relics being fragments of the cloak of St Joseph, of the veil of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Holy Crib of the Lord, borrowed from the Augustinians for this year long pilgrimage in Australia. There is also a relic of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, the first canonised saint of Australia, being a fragment from her coffin gifted by the Sisters of St Joseph. Relics are physical connections with saints or the Lord himself that help us to connect with them spiritually. This traveling cross, created for this year-long pilgrimage, is a traveling "reliquary", and will be present for the 5:30pm Mass at Unanderra church (a Jubilee Pilgrimage site of our Diocese). All are welcome to come along with traditional cultural dress and feel free to bring cultural food to share (and if you plan to bring food pls contact Unanderra Parish for planning purposes).

33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

First Reading: A reading from the prophet Malachi

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

Second Reading:

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians.

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow. We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Lift up your heads and see; your redemption is near at hand. Alleluia!

Gospel: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?' 'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

Communion Antiphon: Amen, I say to you: Whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you will receive, and it shall be given to you, says the Lord.
